### **The Curriculum**

Each course in the Sports, Entertainment, and Arts Law program is three credits, totaling 15 credits.

- Introduction to the Law and Business of Sports,
  Entertainment, and Arts Law (3 Credits)
- Labor & Employment Law in Sports, Entertainment, and Arts (3 Credits)
- Intellectual Property in Sports, Entertainment, and Arts (3 Credits)
- Organization, Finance & Distribution Law in Sports, Entertainment, and Arts (3 Credits)
- Special Topics in Sports, Entertainment, and Arts Law (3 Credits)

# **MSL Online Combined Programs**

Students who successfully complete the Pitt Law SEAL Certificate may apply the 15 credits earned in the online program to the Master of Studies in Law (MSL) degree. This option allows students to earn both the certificate and the MSL in 30 credit hours. Students who decide to pursue the full master's program and complete a certificate program with a 3.0 GPA will be considered for admission.
